Dr. Charles Herty (1892)

Dr. Charles Herty was the father of football at Georgia. After graduating from Georgia he studied at Johns Hopkins University. He returned to Athens as a chemistry professor and introduced the game to students. He arranged for the first game ever played in the deep South: Georgia vs. Mercer, Jan. 30, 1892. He and his old Johns Hopkins classmate, Dr. George Petrie of the Auburn University History Department, arranged for a game between Georgia and Auburn, Feb. 20, 1892, which the Tigers won, 10-0. That historic game inaugurated the South's oldest football rivalry.

Charles McCarthy (1897-1898)

Succeeded Coach "Pop" Warner in 1897. He was formerly a star at Brown University. McCarthy served as coach at Georgia for two seasons. During those two years, Georgia posted a 6-3 overall record. Under the direction of Coach McCarthy, the Dogs recorded their first victory over Georgia Tech (28-0) in the 1897 season.

Billy Reynolds (1901-1902)

Reynolds, a graduate of Princeton and former football star for the Tigers, was not accustomed to losing seasons. He had coached North Carolina for the four previous years, compiling an outstanding record. Coach Reynolds was known for playing up football's virtues and downplaying its vices in a masterful fashion. Reynolds was very popular with the student body. When he left, a crowd of students met him at the depot with a box of cigars and a pipe.

W. S. Whitney (1906-1907)

Arrived at Georgia in 1906. "Bull" Whitney was a graduate of Syracuse and coached North Carolina A&M to an undefeated season. During the 1906 season, the forward pass was legalized. Whitney tried to take advantage of this new play, but it was an erurant pass that led to Georgia's first defeat of that season. Whitney was very superstitious and would not reveal his starting lineup until just before kickoff.

Under the direction of Bocock, including the remaining games of the 1907 season, the Bulldogs recorded a 7-3-1 record.

Dobson installed several trick plays that captivated the UGA fans. Dobson was such a hit at Georgia that he overshadowed Coach Coulter.

George Woodruff (1923-27)

George "Kid" Woodruff, captain and star QB on the 1911 Georgia team, made a great contribution to the Bulldog program as coach from 1923-27. He introduced the Notre Dame formation to the South, bringing in two Knute Rockne disciples, line coach Harry Mehre and backfield coach Frank Thomas, who later became coaches themselves. Woodruff, wealthy Columbus businessman, coached the Bulldogs for one dollar per year.

Georgia's most successful coach in history, compiling overall record of 201-77-10, winning one national championship (1980), six SEC titles (1966, '68, '76, '80, '81, '82), and taking teams to 20 bowl games in his 25 seasons as head coach. Named NCAA National Coach of the Year in 1980 and SEC Coach of the Year seven times. His 201 total victories was second best in the history of the Southeastern Conference and enabled him to become one of only 10 Division I head coaches in NCAA history to win 200 games.
