Bulldogs Battle the Palmetto State: Clemson and USC This Week

Georgia (15-10, 6-3 SEC) won its third straight league series this past weekend including its second on the road (Arkansas and Miss. State). Georgia's ERA in the MSU series was 1.61, allowing just seven runs with 26 strikeouts and four walks. The bullpen did not allow an earned run in 12.2 innings with no walks and 14 strikeouts. Up next, the Bulldogs face Clemson (18-8) here Tuesday and at Clemson Wednesday and then South Carolina (18-7, 6-3 SEC) here in a three-game SEC series starting Friday.

Bulldog junior shortstop **Gordon Beckham**, a National Player of the Year candidate, is batting .454 with 15 home runs, 35 RBI and solid defense at .980 with just two errors in 99 total chances. In SEC action, Beckham is batting .475-6-16. He smashed the go-ahead solo home run in the top of the 10th Sunday at MSU in the 5-3 series-clinching win. Beckham ranks among the national leaders in home runs, total bases and slugging percentage.

Senior closer **Joshua Fields** has six saves in 13 appearances this season. He has not allowed an earned run and tallied 26 strikeouts and four walks in 12.1 innings. The lone run he allowed came on a passed ball versus Miss. State Friday, and he got the loss. He is 0-1 with a 0.00 ERA overall and four of his saves have come in SEC action.

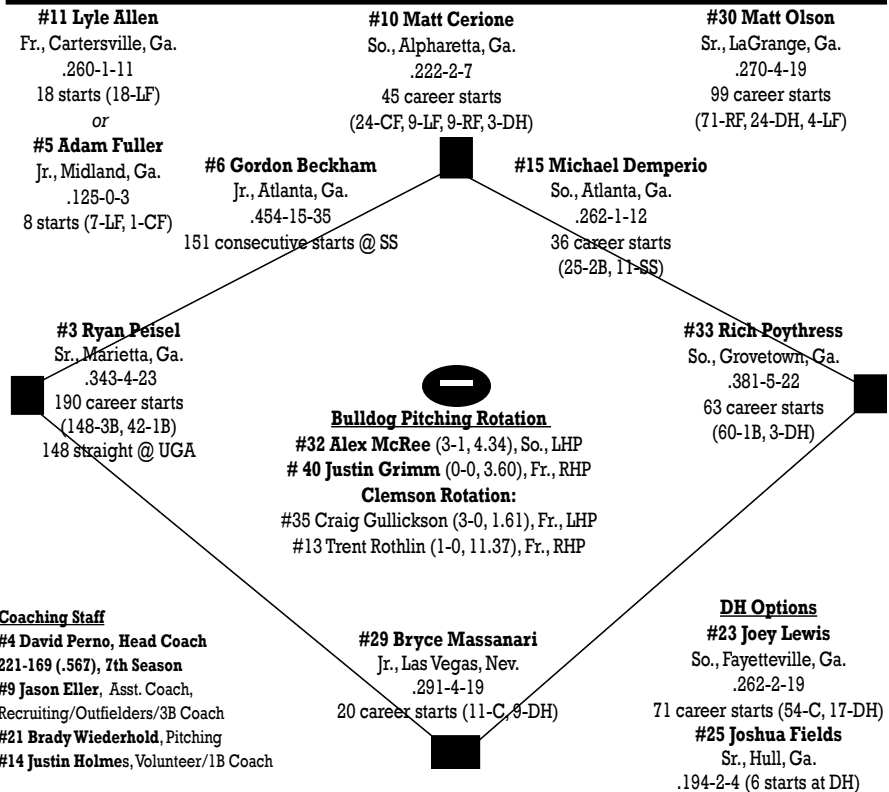
Junior designated hitter/catcher **Bryce Massanari** was Georgia's leading hitter in the MSU series, batting .556 with a pair of two-out RBI and four walks. For the year, he is batting .291-4-19.

Georgia has made its 2008 debut in a national team ranking this week checking in at **No. 27** in Collegiate Baseball's Top 30 poll.

Georgia-Clemson Series

Clemson leads the series 67-44-1 including winning both games last year (4-2 in Athens and 11-10 in Clemson). The teams split a two-game set in 2006 and Georgia claimed a pair of wins over the Tigers in 2005. Georgia has used a staff approach to its midweek games, getting several pitchers work. On Tuesday, the Bulldogs will start sophomore left-hander **Alex McRee** (3-1, 4.34 ERA) while freshman right-hander **Justin Grimm** (0-0, 3.60 ERA) will get the nod Wednesday. McRee earned a win in relief Sunday at Mississippi State, pitching two scoreless innings with three strikeouts. Grimm did not pitch in the MSU series. Grimm's last action came in a start against Western Carolina on March 18 (2 IP, 2H, 2R, 1 BB, 2K). The Tigers will start a pair of freshman in LHP Craig Gullickson (3-0, 1.61 ERA) and RHP Trent Rothlin (1-0, 11.37 ERA).

Bulldog Game Notes-4: News and Notes

A Quick Look at Georgia

The Georgia Bulldogs, under the direction of head coach **David Perno**, have always played a difficult non-conference schedule. This year, Georgia opened up with a three-game set against #1 Arizona and then faced two-time defending national champion #12 Oregon State in Portland. Right before SEC plays, Georgia traveled to #3 Florida State for a two-game set. So while some teams may load up early and build a nice record, Georgia is battle-tested come SEC play.

Georgia (15-10, 6-3 SEC) now has won its first three SEC series including two on the road.

The Bulldogs were picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by the league coaches. Since taking over in 2002, Perno has led Georgia to the NAAs in even numbered years including the College World Series in 2004 and 2006.

No Earned Runs on Fields Yet

Senior All-America closer **Joshua Fields** (0-1, 0.00, 6 SV) has been dominant as he has not allowed an earned run this season.

The 6-0, 182-pound native of Hull, Ga., has 26 strikeouts and four walks in 12.1 innings. He has six saves on the year including three against top 25 foes. Opponents are batting .116 against him.

Currently, Fields ranks third in school history with 29 career saves and 91 career games pitched. Former All-American and first round pick Cris Carpenter (1985-87) holds the saves mark with 33 while Alex Barylak (1991-94) owns the appearance record with 104. Fields was a 2008 third team preseason All-America pick by Baseball America.

Poythress Providing Protection

Sophomore first baseman **Rich Poythress** (.381-5-22) is providing solid protection in the lineup for Bulldog All-America shortstop Gordon Beckham. It marks the second year in a row Poythress has been cleaning up at the fourth spot if teams opt to pitch around Beckham.

Poythress was the top freshman in the Georgia lineup in 2007, finishing his rookie campaign at .282-3-24 in 45 games including 38 starts. This was quite a feat after he went from possible redshirt to everyday cleanup hitter.

Poythress tore his ACL in September of 2006, had surgery in October and made his first start in February of 2007. He has been a regular in the lineup since March 25, 2007, a stretch of 59 straight contests.

Peisel Leading Off

Senior third baseman **Ryan Peisel** (.343-4-23) returned to his role as the leadoff hitter following the first series of the season. Against top-ranked Arizona to start the year, Peisel batted second and sophomore second baseman **Michael Demperio** batted leadoff. After a good start, Demperio has been in a slump, going just 2-for-19 with three runs scored and two RBI last week.

Currently, Peisel is riding an eight-game hittig streak. He batted leadoff for the final 21 games of the 2007 season, tallying a .374 batting average with three home runs and 18 RBI. Peisel and junior shortstop Gordon Beckham have started every game for the Bulldogs since 2006, a stretch of 148 games.

WINNING AN SEC SERIES

Georgia began SEC play this season at #21 Arkansas. The Bulldogs lost the opener 5-1 and trailed 10-1 in game two but then rebounded to win the series, outscoring the Razorbacks 27-3 over the final 14 innings. It marked the fourth time under David Perno, the Bulldogs won an SEC series after dropping game one. Georgia did it again two weeks later at Miss. State

Under Perno, when Georgia wins game one of an SEC series, they have gone on to win 23 out of a possible 28 series. The only five times they have not won the series came to Florida here in 2003 and 2005, at Vanderbilt in 2006 and at Alabama and to Arkansas in 2007.

2008 PITCHING REVIEW

With two College World Series appearances in three NCAA trips, David Perno has twice guided the University of Georgia program to college baseball's ultimate destination.

Perno, 40, begins his 12th year with the Bulldogs including the seventh as head coach. Under Perno, Georgia has shown a standard of excellence on and off the field. He led the Bulldogs to the College World Series (CWS) in 2004 and 2006. Perno has the distinction of going to the CWS with the Bulldogs as a player (1990 national champions), assistant coach (2001) and twice as a head coach. In school history, the Bulldogs have made only seven NCAA Regionals, and three of those trips have been during Perno's tenure.

Player development is another highlight in the Perno era. A total of 21 Bulldogs have had the opportunity to play professional baseball after coming to Georgia as a non-drafted player. Also, seven Bulldogs have improved their draft status the next time they were selected.

Georgia annually plays one of the nation's most challenging schedules including recent home-and-home series with defending national champion Oregon State, Southern California, Arizona, Clemson and Georgia Tech. In 2007, the Bulldogs played the second most games against ranked opponents of any Southeastern Conference (SEC) school and collected the second most wins despite having one of the youngest teams in the league. Georgia freshmen pitchers made 86 appearances, and Bulldog freshmen hitters tallied 703 at bats, and these totals ranked among the top three of any SEC team.

In only his third season at the helm, the Athens native and Georgia alumnus was honored as the 2004 College Coach of the Year by Baseball America. Perno guided the Bulldogs to a third place finish at the 2004 College World Series, a share of the Southeastern Conference title and a final national ranking of fourth. The Bulldogs went 45-23 in 2004, setting school

records with a 12-game SEC winning streak, 28 games televised and the highest total attendance and per game average in Foley Field history.

In 2006, the Bulldogs showcased another sizzling second half performance that featured a 13-game winning streak, going 23-7 over their final 30 games. In the SEC, they went 15-5 in their last 20 games to finish second in the Eastern Division and third overall. Georgia eliminated Florida State to win a regional and South Carolina to capture a super regional to punch another ticket to Omaha. The Bulldogs concluded the year 47-23 and ranked sixth nationally. The 47 wins tied for the second most in school history. Under Perno, student-athletes have made the annual SEC Academic Honor Roll 65 times including a record 13 in 2003 and 2007. A total of 30 Bulldogs have signed professional contracts, seven have earned Freshman All-America honors, six have been named First Team All-SEC and one has made the USA Baseball National Summer Team.

On July 21, 2001, Perno became the 24th baseball coach in school history. He had just completed his fifth year on the Georgia staff including his second under Ron Polk. During his tenure as a Bulldog, Perno's recruiting efforts helped build the program back to a force in the SEC. Perno's initial charge as head coach was to sustain the momentum created by the 2001 Bulldogs that captured the SEC title and advanced to the College World Series. Perno guided a youthful squad to the 2002 NCAA Atlanta Regional final and a record of 32-29. It marked the only time in school history that Georgia had made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament. Georgia's 2002 schedule ranked among the toughest in the country, featuring 32 road games.

Perno is married to the former Melaney Chastain of Athens, Ga. They have two children, Saidee Woodlyn (8) and David Hayes (4).

FOLEY FIELD: Home of the Georgia Bulldogs

Foley Field, constructed at a cost of \$3.5 million in 1990, is one of the finest baseball complexes in the country. Various renovation projects in the last decade have helped maintain its place among the top college stadiums. Capacity of 3,291 includes chairback and bleacher-style seating. Foley Field is named for former letterman Judge Frank Foley, who is considered one of Georgia's all-time greats for his contributions both on and off the field. He was a part of the 1908 Southern championship team that recorded an impressive 20-2 mark. He was a distinguished alumnus who is remembered by many as a kind and caring gentleman. His enthusiasm for UGA was second to none.

The Bulldogs who made it that return in 2008 are the following: **Esmonde, Holder, Starr, Woolley plus Gordon Beckham, Jason Leaver, Matt Olson, Ryan Peisel, Alex McRee and Robbie O'Bryan**.

2008 GEORGIA-ATLANTA BRAVES REVIEW

For the 10th time since 1988, Georgia faced the Atlanta Braves in the Spring Training opener for the major league club in Florida. Both teams use wood bats in the exhibition along with a 10-player lineup and a designated hitter. With this year's 8-0 win, Atlanta is 10-0 in the series including. The closest games came in 1991 and 1996 when the Braves won 2-1. Atlanta plays its regular position players for the first part of the game while the pitchers are mainly its top prospects. However, twice the Braves have started a Major Leaguer on the mound including in 2006 (Horacio Ramirez).

In the 2008 exhibition, Georgia mustered seven hits but were blanked by five Braves prospects starting with Charlie Morton followed by Zach Schreiber, Jorge Campillo, Francisely Bueno and Ryan Basner. Senior **Ryan Peisel** went 3-for-4 including a double while junior **Gordon Beckham** had a pair of hits, sophomore **Michael Demperio** had a double and sophomore **Matt Cerione** had a single.

Did You Know? Georgia alumnus and head coach David Perno pinch-hit in the 1988 exhibition and struck out against John Smoltz. Also, he started at third base in the 1991 game and went 0-for-3. He credits the at bat against Smoltz in helping him decide it was time to focus on a coaching career!

TROUPE UPDATE

Georgia freshman football/baseball student-athlete **Israel Troupe** may see action once spring football practice is over. Troupe, a 6-1, 215-pound wide receiver/outfielder from Tifton, Ga., was redshirted in football this past season. He worked out briefly with the baseball team in the fall and in the preseason before returning to football conditioning and spring practice. Troupe, a 31st round selection of the Colorado Rockies in the 2007 MLB draft, is on a UGA football scholarship. The last Bulldog to play football and baseball was cornerback/outfielder Erik Robinson of Orlando in 1996.

FUTURE BULLDOGS

Now in his second year as the Bulldogs recruiting coordinator, Jason Eller has assembled one of the biggest and best classes in school history.

Georgia's signing class for the 2009 season features six student-athletes (seven if you count football signee Xavier Avery) that were listed among the Top 100 High School Prospects in the country according to *Baseball America*. The rankings are based on future potential and not signability or where they could be drafted in 2008.

Georgia led the nation with seven players on the Top 100. Also, the publication listed the prep players with the "Best Tools." Pitchers Michael Palazzone and Brett Devall were among the seven mentioned with the "Best Fastball." Both have hit 94 on the radar gun, and Devall was mentioned as being the "hardest throwing pure left-hander." Avery was among the four "Best Athletes."

Last year, a record eight members of Georgia's recruiting class were selected in the 2007 MLB draft including a first round pick (Ben Revere, Minnesota) and five others during the first 18 rounds. Four of the the eight signees drafted made it to Georgia this year.

ATHENS---Top-ranked Arizona won the series 2-1. Georgia outslugged the Wildcats in the season opener as All-America closer Joshua Fields got two hits including a home run as the DH and then registered a save when he struck out the side in the ninth.
