### Final Weekend Series Before SEC Play

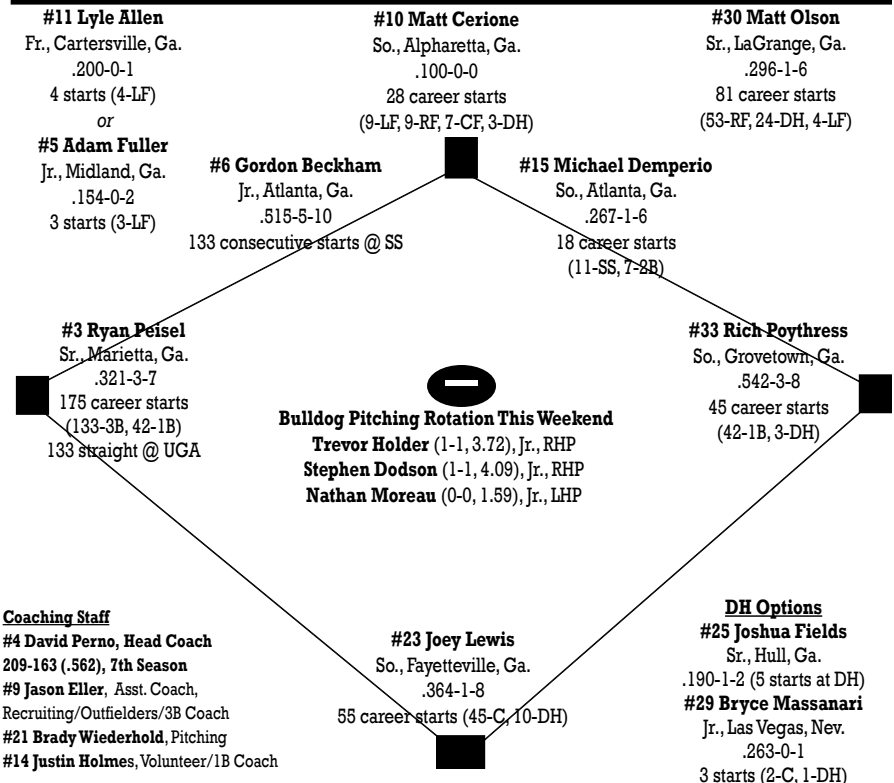
Georgia (3-4) entertains the Memphis Tigers (4-6) in a three-game series beginning Friday at 6:30 p.m. The Bulldogs are coming off their biggest offensive outbursts since 2004 (beat Liberty 24-6). On Wednesday, Georgia routed Jacksonville State 19-1, smashing six home runs while six pitchers combined on a two-hitter. The Bulldogs went 20-for-44 in the victory and raised their batting average 30 points to .311. Meanwhile, Memphis dropped a doubleheader Wednesday to Creighton 11-3 and 10-8. Former Bulldog assistant coach Daron Schoenrock coaches the Tigers. He was the pitching coach for the Bulldogs under Ron Polk from 2000-01. He followed Polk to Miss. State in 2002 and remained on his staff until going to Memphis in 2005.

The Bulldogs opened the year 1-2 against top-ranked Arizona here. Then, Georgia went 1-2 versus #12 Oregon State at PGE Park in Portland that drew close to 30,000 fans. Georgia dropped a one-run contest in the rubber game of those series. Against Memphis, Georgia will employ the same weekend rotation of juniors Trevor Holder (1-1, 3.72), Stephen Dodson (1-1, 4.09) and Nathan Moreau (0-0, 1.59). After Memphis, Georgia has a five-game roadtrip. The Bulldogs will be at #20 Florida State (9-0) Tuesday and Wednesday and then begin SEC play at Arkansas (8-1).

### Beckham and Poythress: En Fuego Against The Nation's Top Teams

Georgia sophomore first baseman Rich Poythress (.542-3-8, 1.042 SLG%) and junior shortstop Gordon Beckham (.515-5-10, 1.121 SLG%) rank among the SEC leaders in batting, and what's more impressive is that they've done it mostly against #1 Arizona and at #12 Oregon State. Kentucky senior first baseman Sawyer Carroll leads the SEC in batting and RBI at .618-5-25 but the undefeated Wildcats (10-0) have not faced any ranked teams this year. Also, the Bulldog pair have displayed excellent defense. Poythress is perfect on the year in 44 total chances while Beckham has one error on a flyball in foul territory at Oregon State. He is fielding .947 in 19 total chances and has helped turn four double plays.

# Bulldog Game Notes-3: News and Notes

## UNDER THE RADAR IS GOOD

The Georgia Bulldogs, under the direction of head coach **David Perno**, have always played a difficult non-conference schedule. This year, Georgia opened up with a three-game set against #1 Arizona and then faced two-time defending national champion #12 Oregon State in Portland. Right before SEC plays, Georgia travels to Florida State for a two-game set. So while some teams may load up early and build a nice record, Georgia is battle-tested come SEC play.

The Bulldogs were picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by the league coaches. Generally, the Bulldogs have fared well when not much has been predicted of them. Since taking over in 2002, Perno has led the Bulldogs to the NCAAAs in even numbered years including the College World Series in 2004 and 2006.

Georgia's 2008 Opening Day lineup featured seven returning lettermen plus two transfers. The newcomers were second baseman **Michael Demperio** (Univ. Texas) and left fielder **Adam Fuller** (Andrew JC). For the most part at DH, senior **Joshua Fields** will start while junior transfer **Bryce Massanari** (College of Southern Nevada) is an option too. Also, freshman **Lyle Allen** is a candidate in left field this season.

## PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN DUO PERFORMING WELL

University of Georgia junior shortstop **Gordon Beckham** and senior pitcher/DH **Joshua Fields** earned spots on the 2008 *Baseball America* Preseason All-America team. Beckham was selected to the first team while Fields made the third team. *Baseball America* annually polls scouting directors to vote on the team and make their selections based on performance, talent and major league potential. In the past, the preseason All-America team has been a predictor both of the first round of the draft and of team success. For example, of the 11 draft-eligible players on last year's first team, seven were drafted in the first or supplemental first round, three were drafted in the second round and one received a \$1.1 million bonus as a fifth-round pick.

Beckham, a 6-0, 185-pound native of Atlanta, has started every game since stepping on campus, a streak of 133 games. This year, he is batting .515-5-10. He led the team with 13 home runs and 51 RBI last year while batting .307. Then, he earned Cape Cod Summer League All-Star honors with a league-best nine home runs and 35 RBI for champion Yarmouth-Dennis.

Fields, a 6-0, 182-pound native of Hull, has tallied 24 saves and seven wins in his Bulldog career. This year, he is 0-0. 0.00 ERA, 1 SV, 9K in 3.1 IP. He was a second round pick of the Atlanta Braves last year after collecting seven saves and a 1-6 mark. His finest season came in 2006 when he tied a school record with 15 saves while going 3-2 with a 1.80 ERA in leading Georgia to the College World Series.

## #1 Arizona Series Recap

Georgia opened the 2008 season with a thrilling 9-7 win over top-ranked Arizona as closer/designated hitter **Joshua Fields** went 2-for-4 with a home run and then struck out the side in the ninth for a save.

The Wildcats rallied to win the series, taking the next two contests 7-1 and 9-8. Saturday's game was 2-1 heading to the eighth before Arizona broke it open. On Sunday, Georgia led 4-0 going to the seventh before the Wildcats stormed back and eventually took a 9-4 lead to the ninth. Georgia smashed a couple of home runs to plate four in the final frame but the rally fell short.

Georgia's starting rotation of junior right-handers **Trevor Holder** and **Stephen Dodson** along with left-hander **Nathan Moreau** combined to go 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA against the potent Wildcats. Moreau had the most impressive start, pitching six scoreless innings allowing just three hits, two of which were bunt singles.

Offensively, sophomore first baseman **Rich Poythress** had the best weekend, batting .625 (5-for-8, HR, 3RBI, 5 BB) while junior shortstop **Gordon Beckham** hit .538 (7-for-13) and senior third baseman **Ryan Peisel** hit a pair of home runs and drove in four. Georgia and Arizona both hit .286 with five home runs in the series.

## #12 Oregon State Series Recap

Georgia faced a stiff test for its first roadtrip as nearly 30,000 fans attended the three-game series with two-time defending national champion Oregon State at PGE Park in Portland. The Bulldogs dropped the opener 6-4, won game two 10-5 and saw the Beavers rally back in the final 5-4, scoring the winning run on an eighth-inning wild pitch.

The Bulldogs employed the same rotation of **Holder-Dodson-Moreau**, and they combined for a 1-1 mark and 3.60 ERA in 15 innings. A couple defensive lapses cost the Bulldogs in game one as the Beavers scored five unearned runs while the bullpen failed to hold a 4-2 lead in the sixth inning of game three.

Offensively and defensively, **Beckham** and **Poythress** enjoyed another fine weekend. Beckham hit .500-2-3, going 7-for-14 with a 1.143 SLG% while Poythress batted .462-1-4 (6-for-13). The duo made their share of sterling defensive plays as well.

With two College World Series appearances in three NCAA trips, David Perno has twice guided the University of Georgia program to college baseball's ultimate destination.

Perno, 40, begins his 12th year with the Bulldogs including the seventh as head coach. Under Perno, Georgia has shown a standard of excellence on and off the field. He led the Bulldogs to the College World Series (CWS) in 2004 and 2006. Perno has the distinction of going to the CWS with the Bulldogs as a player (1990 national champions), assistant coach (2001) and twice as a head coach. In school history, the Bulldogs have made only seven NCAA Regionals, and three of those trips have been during Perno's tenure.

Player development is another highlight in the Perno era. A total of 21 Bulldogs have had the opportunity to play professional baseball after coming to Georgia as a non-drafted player. Also, seven Bulldogs have improved their draft status the next time they were selected.

Georgia annually plays one of the nation's most challenging schedules including recent home-and-home series with defending national champion Oregon State, Southern California, Arizona, Clemson and Georgia Tech. In 2007, the Bulldogs played the second most games against ranked opponents of any Southeastern Conference (SEC) school and collected the second most wins despite having one of the youngest teams in the league. Georgia freshmen pitchers made 86 appearances, and Bulldog freshmen hitters tallied 703 at bats, and these totals ranked among the top three of any SEC team.

In only his third season at the helm, the Athens native and Georgia alumnus was honored as the 2004 College Coach of the Year by Baseball America. Perno guided the Bulldogs to a third place finish at the 2004 College World Series, a share of the Southeastern Conference title and a final national ranking of fourth. The Bulldogs went 45-23 in 2004, setting school

records with a 12-game SEC winning streak, 28 games televised and the highest total attendance and per game average in Foley Field history.

In 2006, the Bulldogs showcased another sizzling second half performance that featured a 13-game winning streak, going 23-7 over their final 30 games. In the SEC, they went 15-5 in their last 20 games to finish second in the Eastern Division and third overall. Georgia eliminated Florida State to win a regional and South Carolina to capture a super regional to punch another ticket to Omaha. The Bulldogs concluded the year 47-23 and ranked sixth nationally. The 47 wins tied for the second most in school history. Under Perno, student-athletes have made the annual SEC Academic Honor Roll 65 times including a record 13 in 2003 and 2007. A total of 30 Bulldogs have signed professional contracts, seven have earned Freshman All-America honors, six have been named First Team All-SEC and one has made the USA Baseball National Summer Team.

On July 21, 2001, Perno became the 24th baseball coach in school history. He had just completed his fifth year on the Georgia staff including his second under Ron Polk. During his tenure as a Bulldog, Perno's recruiting efforts helped build the program back to a force in the SEC. Perno's initial charge as head coach was to sustain the momentum created by the 2001 Bulldogs that captured the SEC title and advanced to the College World Series. Perno guided a youthful squad to the 2002 NCAA Atlanta Regional final and a record of 32-29. It marked the only time in school history that Georgia had made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament. Georgia's 2002 schedule ranked among the toughest in the country, featuring 32 road games.

Perno is married to the former Melaney Chastain of Athens, Ga. They have two children, Saidee Woodlyn (8) and David Hayes (4).

### FOLEY FIELD: Home of the Georgia Bulldogs

Foley Field, constructed at a cost of \$3.5 million in 1990, is one of the finest baseball complexes in the country. Various renovation projects in the last decade have helped maintain its place among the top college stadiums. Capacity of 3,291 includes chairback and bleacher-style seating. Foley Field is named for former letterman Judge Frank Foley, who is considered one of Georgia's all-time greats for his contributions both on and off the field. He was a part of the 1908 Southern championship team that recorded an impressive 20-2 mark. He was a distinguished alumnus who is remembered by many as a kind and caring gentleman. His enthusiasm for UGA was second to none.

## 2008 GEORGIA-ATLANTA BRAVES REVIEW

For the 10th time since 1988, Georgia faced the Atlanta Braves in the Spring Training opener for the major league club in Florida. Both teams use wood bats in the exhibition along with a 10-player lineup and a designated hitter. With this year's 8-0 win, Atlanta is 10-0 in the series including. The closest games came in 1991 and 1996 when the Braves won 2-1. Atlanta plays its regular position players for the first part of the game while the pitchers are mainly its top prospects. However, twice the Braves have started a Major Leaguer on the mound including in 2006 (Horacio Ramirez).

In the 2008 exhibition, Georgia mustered seven hits but were blanked by five Braves prospects starting with Charlie Morton followed by Zach Schreiber, Jorge Campillo, Francisely Bueno and Ryan Basner. Senior **Ryan Peisel** went 3-for-4 including a double while junior **Gordon Beckham** had a pair of hits, sophomore **Michael Demperio** had a double and sophomore **Matt Cerione** had a single.

**Did You Know?** Georgia alumnus and head coach David Perno pinch-hit in the 1988 exhibition and struck out against John Smoltz. Also, he started at third base in the 1991 game and went 0-for-3. He credits the at bat against Smoltz in helping him decide it was time to focus on a coaching career!

## FUTURE BULLDOGS

Now in his second year as the Bulldogs recruiting coordinator, Jason Eller has assembled one of the biggest and best classes in school history.

Georgia's signing class for the 2009 season features six student-athletes (seven if you count football signee Xavier Avery) that were listed among the Top 100 High School Prospects in the country according to *Baseball America*. The rankings are based on future potential and not signability or where they could be drafted in 2008.

Georgia led the nation with seven players on the Top 100. Also, the publication listed the prep players with the "Best Tools." Pitchers Michael Palazzone and Brett Devall were among the seven mentioned with the "Best Fastball." Both have hit 94 on the radar gun, and Devall was mentioned as being the "hardest throwing pure left-hander." Avery was among the four "Best Athletes."

Last year, a record eight members of Georgia's recruiting class were selected in the 2007 MLB draft including a first round pick (Ben Revere, Minnesota) and five others during the first 18 rounds. Four of the eight signees drafted made it to Georgia this year.
