GEORGIA AT SOUTH CAROLINA: No. 15 Georgia will close out the regular season with a three-game series at South Carolina. Game times are Thursday at 7:05, Friday at 7:05 and Sunday at 7:05, and all three games will be televised by SportSouth. The Bulldogs are second in the SEC East, two games behind Florida and a game ahead of third place South Carolina. Georgia enters the weekend fifth overall in the league while South Carolina is seventh, and both teams have clinched berths in next week's SEC Tournament. The Bulldogs will try to win a series at South Carolina for the first time since 1994. The Gamecocks have won the last six series between the two schools in Columbia, taking two of three in 1996, 1998 and 2007 and earning sweeps in 2000, 2003 and 2005. Georgia will again use the rotation of Trevor Holder (7-3, 4.73 ERA), Alex McRee (4-2, 4.35 ERA) and Justin Grimm (2-3, 4.36). South Carolina will counter with Sam Dyson (7-4, 5.70 ERA), Nolan Belcher (3-3, 5.48 ERA) and Blake Cooper (7-4, 4.74 ERA). Georgia is coming off a 7-5 win over Georgia Tech Tuesday at Turner Field in Atlanta. The Bulldogs had a 5-2 lead, but Tech scored three in the seventh to pull even. Lyle Allen's two run single in the top of the ninth lifted the Bulldogs to the win in front of 24,665 fans, the sixth largest regular season crowd in college baseball history.

WHO'S HOT: First baseman **Rich Poythress** is second in the SEC with 75 RBI and is two shy of tying Gordon Beckham's school record 77 RBI last year. He is the first player in Georgia history to record two 70 RBI seasons after driving in 75 runs a year ago. Poythress is ranked in the top two in the SEC in eight statistical categories including first in hits and second in RBI, batting average, on-base percentage, total bases, runs, slugging percentage and home runs....**Matt Cerione** has 12 hits in Georgia's last eight games. He had a two-run single in the fourth inning of Georgia's 7-5 win over Georgia Tech on Tuesday and had the game-winning hit in the bottom of the ninth against Vanderbilt on Sunday that snapped Georgia's eight-game losing streak. He had walkoff hits in back-to-back games against Arkansas on April 17 and 18. The Bulldogs won both Arkansas games and the Vanderbilt game 4-3...Freshman **Colby May** has hit safely in eight of the last nine games and is second on the team with a .348 average. He has started all 52 games at third base...**Levi Hyams** has hit safely in eight of the last 11 games and his .304 average in all SEC games this season is second on the team...**Bryce Massanari** has four hits in the last three games including two against Georgia Tech on Tuesday with a towering two-run homer 12 rows deep into the left field seats...**Lyle Allen** led the team with three hits and his single in the top of the ninth scored two runs was the difference in Georgia's 7-5 win...**Justin Earls** had his best outing of the season Tuesday at Turner Field. He tossed a season-high three scoreless innings and retired nine out of 10 batters faced; the only batter to reach was on an error...Georgia closer **Dean Weaver** has earned the win in Georgia's last two games, allowing just one hit in 3.1 scoreless innings in relief. In his last nine appearances, Weaver is 3-2 with four saves.

TIDBITS: Georgia has the SEC's best road record this season with a 13-5 mark, and no other team in the league has more than 11 road wins...Georgia is 12-4 in TV games this season...Georgia is 6-2 in one-run games... The Bulldogs have played just one extra-inning game this season...The Bulldogs are 30-3 when leading after six innings and 2-13 when trailing after six innings...Georgia has hit 95 home runs this year. Entering this season, the Bulldogs were averaging 63.4 home runs per season in the David Perno era...The Bulldogs' seven home runs against Kennesaw State on April 21 is tied with LSU's seven blasts against Illinois on March 7 for the most home runs by an SEC team this season.. Joey Lewis is batting .372 with 12 home runs and 40 RBI in 30 games as a catcher this year and .171 with four home runs and 11 RBI in 22 games as a DH...Bryce Massanari's 13 home runs in SEC games leads the league...The Bulldogs have scored in the first inning 28 times this year, and have won 20 of those games...Last

year vs. South Carolina, Rich Poythress hit .500 (4-for-8) with four walks a double and two RBI.

SINGLE SEASON RBI RECORD: Last season Gordon Beckham broke the Georgia record for most RBI in a season with 77. His teammate Rich Poythress actually had the second most ever with 75. Beckham averaged 1.08 RBI per game in his record-setting season last year, and Poythress is averaging 1.44 RBI per game this season. Through 52 games a year ago, Gordon Beckham was batting .401 with 22 home runs and 55 RBI. Through 52 games this season, Poythress is batting .387 with 21 home runs and 75 RBI.

POYTHRESS' BIG NIGHT: Rich Poythress went 4-for-4 with three home runs, a double and a walk in Georgia's 11-7 win over Kennesaw State on April 21. He became the seventh Georgia player to hit three home runs in a game and first since Jeff Keppinger in the Bulldogs' thrilling win against Coastal Carolina in the 2001 NCAA Athens Regional. Poythress' three-home run performance came on Keppinger's 29th birthday and it also occurred on the night that Poythress' nine-year old brother Jared served as the Bulldogs' bat boy. Poythress' double in the first inning narrowly missed leaving the park. He is now fifth all-time

MASSANARI'S BIG DAY: Just five days after Rich Poythress hit three home runs against Kennesaw State, Bryce Massanari went 4-for-5 with three home runs and five RBI at Ole Miss. His second home run tied the game in the sixth and his third blast gave Georgia a two-run lead in the seventh before the Rebels rallied to win. He became the eighth Bulldog to hit three home runs in a game.

FIRST HALF: For the second straight year, Georgia was alone in first place at the halfway point of the SEC race. In the last two years, the Bulldogs were 23-7 in the first half of SEC play. This year's mark of 11-4 is one win shy of last year's 12-3 record, the best start to SEC play under David Perno. In five of the last seven seasons under Perno, the Bulldogs posted a better second half in SEC play. The two exceptions were Perno's first season in 2002 when Georgia went 8-7 in the first 15 league games and then 7-8, and last year when the Bulldogs went 8-6-1 in the second half, having clinched the SEC title by week nine. Georgia's best second half came in 2004 when it surged to the SEC crown by going 13-2. The 2006 squad nearly matched that by going 12-3 to finished second in the East and third in the league overall.

PERNO THIRD ON WINS LIST: Last season, David Perno passed former Georgia coach W.P. White (1921-33) and moved into third on the school's all-time wins list. Steve Webber (1981-96) is first with 500 wins followed by Jim Whatley (1950, 52-75) with 336 wins and Perno with 286 wins. Perno and Whatley are tied for the most SEC Championships (2) and Perno is the leader in College World Series appearances (3).

2,000: Georgia began its 122nd baseball season this year, and the Bulldogs recorded the 2,000th win in program history with a 4-3 victory at Tennessee on March 29. Baseball at UGA dates back to 1886 and it is the oldest sport on campus. Georgia's all-time record is 2,013-1,493-23, and throughout history the Bulldogs have six SEC championships, six College World Series appearances, three in the last five years, and one national title.

ATTENDANCE RECORDS: A record total of 93,360 fans attended Georgia's home games this year, breaking the previous mark of 93,152 last year, which also includes the

postseason. A record 12,026 fans attended the three games against Mississippi State including 4,461 on March 21, the largest crowd ever at Foley Field. A total of 4,092 fans attended the April 4 game against LSU, the sixth-largest crowd in stadium history. UGA set an opening weekend home attendance record with a total of 8,868 fans in the three-game series against Youngstown State, breaking the previous mark set against Oregon State in 2007. The Feb. 20 game attracted 3,044 fans, the largest crowd ever for a season opener at Foley Field. The Spring Baseball Classic for Kids at Turner Field between Georgia and Georgia Tech drew 24,665 fans, the sixth largest regular season crowd in college baseball history.

GOOD START: Georgia's 14-0 start to the season surpassed the 9-0 start by the 1911 team for the best in school history, and it also tied the second longest winning streak in school history. During the 14-0 start, the Bulldogs ascended to No. 1 in two national polls (Collegiate Baseball and NCBWA) and scored double digit runs in 11 games. UGA played 100 innings to start the season without trailing at the end of an inning.

100 INNINGS WITHOUT TRAILING: It took 12 games and 101 innings, but Georgia finally found itself trailing at the end of an inning. Quinnipiac hit a two run homer in the top of the second on March 8 and held Georgia scoreless in the bottom of the inning, the first time the Bulldogs were behind at the end of an inning. It was also the first time Georgia trailed at any point since the sixth inning against Youngstown State on Feb. 22. It didn't take long to regain the lead as Georgia scored one run each in the third and fourth innings, four runs in the fifth, and went on to win 7-2.

FIVE FRESHMEN START: For the first time in the David Perno era, Georgia started five freshmen on opening day, and the rookies didn't disappoint. They had eight of the Bulldogs' 17 hits on opening day, and in all, Georgia's six true freshman accounted for 23 of the team's 47 hits during opening weekend including Johnathan Taylor with eight, Levi Hyams and Chase Davidson with four, Colby May with three and Zach Cone and Peter Verdin with two apiece.

POYTHRESS' NATIONAL HONORS: Junior first baseman Rich Poythress was named SEC player

of the Week, National Player of the Week, National Hitter of the Week, Southeast Region Co-Player of the Week and a member of the College Baseball Foundation's Weekly All-Star lineup earlier this season after he hit .615 (8-for-13) with five home runs and 12 RBI in four games against Wright State and Tennessee. Against Wright State, he hit a two-run home run in the first inning, then had his first career multi-home run game along with two doubles and two walks for a career-high 12 total bases against Tennessee on Friday. He followed that with another two-home run performance on Saturday and tied his career high with five RBI. In his first nine plate appearances against the Vols, Poythress was 6-for-6 with four home runs, two doubles and three walks.

TAYLOR HONORED BY SEC: Johnathan Taylor earned the SEC's first Freshman of the Week Award of the 2009 season after serving as the catalyst for the Georgia offense that scored 41 runs during opening weekend. The Acworth, Ga., native batted .800 (8-for-10) with a double, triple and five RBI against Youngstown State. Taylor reached base safely 20 times in 26 appearances to start the season. He already has 15 stolen bases in 21 games; the single season Georgia record is 31 by Chaz Lytle in 2002.

TOP COLLEGE PROSPECTS: Georgia juniors Alex McRee, Rich Poythress and Dean Weaver along with senior Trevor Holder are among the top 100 college prospects for 2009 as compiled by Baseball America. Georgia led all SEC schools with four on the list followed by Ole Miss and Tennessee with three apiece. The publication listed McRee as the No. 26 college prospect in the nation followed by Poythress at No. 33, Weaver at No. 85 and Holder at No. 92. McRee is the fourth highest rated left-hander, trailing only Vanderbilt junior Mike Minor (No. 5), and the Oklahoma State junior duo of Andrew Oliver (No. 8), and Tyler Lyons (No. 19). Poythress is one of only three first basemen in the top 40. North Carolina junior Dustin Ackley (No. 4) and Clemson junior Ben Paulsen (No. 24) are the other first basemen. There were

A POPULAR PRESEASON PICK: The Bulldogs were picked to win the SEC Eastern Division with 10 first place votes in the preseason poll voted one by league coaches. Georgia received on vote to win the overall league title, while LSU was the favorite with 10 votes. The Bulldogs were also picked to win the SEC East by Rivals.com and were ranked in the top five in three different preseason polls: Collegiate Baseball (4), ESPN/USA Today (4) and NCBWA (5).

GEORGIA AT FOLEY FIELD: Georgia is in its 44th year playing at Foley Field where the Bulldogs own a 439-238-1 record since the 1990 renovation. The largest crowd to watch a game at Foley Field was 4,461 on March 21, 2009 when third-ranked Georgia topped No. 25 Mississippi State, 4-0. The stadium's capacity is 3,291.
